Report of the National Level Webinar on 'Cancer Awareness' Organized in collaboration with GAD-TLC & ICS, New Delhi

A National Level Webinar on Cancer Awareness was organized by the college in collaboration with Guru Angad Dev Teaching Learning Centre and Indian Cancer Society, New Delhi on 5th October 2024. Mrs. Aruna Ummat, Joint Secretary of Indian cancer Society spoke on Cervical Cancer, HPV and HPV Vaccination. She said that cervical cancer is the fourth most common cancer among women worldwide, responsible for 342,000 deaths in 2020. Cervical cancer is primarily caused by untreated HPV infections, with risk factors including early marriage, early sexual activity, poor genital hygiene and co-infections with HIV. Ignorance of the disease, especially in rural areas and the absence of regular screenings contribute significantly to its high mortality rate. Ms. Aruna Ummat emphasized that HPV is asymptomatic in its early stages, leading to undetected cases until the disease advances. She has strongly appealed all the participants to adopt a mindset to make themselves a priority in the fight against cancer.

Aruna Ummat presented about the Pap smear, HPV DNA tests and visual inspection with acetic acid (VIA), all of which are crucial for early detection. She stressed that cervical cancer is highly preventable with regular screening and HPV vaccination, which has shown to significantly reduce infection rates. The HPV vaccine is particularly important for young women, and guidelines recommend its administration to girls between 9-14 years before they become sexually active. Additionally, she spoke about how cervical cancer and other cancers, such as anal, vaginal, and penile cancers, are associated with HPV, stressing the need for increased awareness, screening, and vaccination to save lives. Awareness and prevention were the key elements of her talk, especially in reducing the burden of cervical cancer in low-resource settings.

She has concluded by stressing that tackling cancer requires proactive measures, combining healthy lifestyle choices, early detection, and equitable access to medical care.

Another eminent speaker, the Educationist and the Former Principal of DPS School, Gurgaon, Haryana, Ms. Sunitha Nagapal highlighted the significant causes of cancer, emphasizing that both lifestyle and environmental factors play a crucial role. She noted that 40 out of every 200 cancers are caused by tobacco use, while other modifiable risk factors include alcohol consumption, obesity, and poor reproductive health. Factors such as DNA damage from carcinogens, stress, and a sedentary lifestyle further contribute to cancer risk. Non-modifiable risks like environmental pollution, radiation, and genetic predisposition were also discussed. Additionally, Ms. Nagapal stressed that symptoms like bowel changes, unusual bleeding, and lumps must not be ignored.

Preventive measures to combat cancer were outlined, including maintaining a healthy diet, weight management, quitting tobacco, limiting alcohol, regular physical activity, and receiving vaccinations like HPV. Ms. Nagapal underscored the need for active choices in preventing cancer, stating that 30-50% of cancers are preventable through conscious lifestyle changes. The

importance of early detection and regular medical screenings was also discussed, as many cancers, when caught early, have higher survival rates. She concluded with the powerful message that the conquest of cancer should be "by choice, not by chance," advocating for increased public awareness and personal responsibility in combating this global health issue.

In his presidential address, Prof. B.V. Sambashivaiah emphasized the urgent need for awareness regarding cancer, which is responsible for 10 million deaths globally in 2020, according to WHO. He noted that despite advancements in treatment, cancers like breast, lung, colorectal and cervical cancer continue to impact millions. In India alone, over 1.39 million new cases were reported in 2020, with 850,000 deaths.

Prof. Sambashivaiah highlighted the alarming shift from traditional diets to modern, processed foods, contributing to lifestyle diseases such as cancer. He called for a return to healthier food practices and active efforts to educate the public on the importance of early detection, vaccination (such as for HPV), and regular screenings, which can reduce cancer incidence by 30-50%. The role of organizations like the Indian Cancer Society, which conducts awareness and screening programs, was applauded for helping bridge healthcare access gaps, particularly in rural areas.

The Principal of the college Dr. M. Prabhu Welcomed. IQAC Coordinator Dr. N Rajendraprasad moderated and proposed Vote of Thanks.

More than 150 participants from teachers, office staff and students have taken part in the webinar. The webinar was also live streamed through YouTube.
